From the Archives...

The nation's first electric streetcar ambulance was introduced in St. Louis on December 27,1894. It was designed by Dr. George Homan, the St. Louis City Health Commissioner. He said his inspiration came from railway post office streetcars, which also originated in St. Louis in 1891. Built by St. Louis Car Company, the

exterior of the car was white, trimmed with gold and blue, and donned red crosses, signifying its use as a medical vehicle. It had special construction features to minimize road noise and reduce bumps so patients could be moved comfortably. The interior of the car was finished in cherry and furnished with electric lights and heat. It was divided in the center to create separate compartments for men and women. Staffed by a doctor, a male nurse, and a motorman, the St. Louis streetcar ambulance made regular stops transporting patients to and from the various hospitals and dispensaries around town.




