I BOUGHT IT!

My oldest grandson Justin and I left yesterday morning at 7:15 and returned home at 9 last evening. We arrived in Greene, Iowa a small country town in the middle of nowhere. Turns out *Coyote Classics* specializes in muscle cars. Their business cards say "Your Midwest Muscle Car Dealer" but the owner, Chad Austin (late 40s, early 50s) was at an auction in Florida a few months ago and this Ford was too good not to buy! His wife and son work there plus several other staff that I saw.

The green color is very attractive....I just had no memory from my youth of this color offering. I checked it over and great paint job, probably one re-paint he thought. A nick or two. I tapped the fenders and lower panels and all sounded "tinny" as we, I, used to say, except for one spot between the lower edge of the driver's door and the rear fender where the panel bends out to meet the level of the running board. I had a magnet but too weak to detect. Tapping it sounded too "solid" rather than "tinny"....compared to the same area on the right side. Other than that...great! Chrome, grill, trim beautiful! Glass clear. Left door handle a bit hard to turn down to open. Trunk clean, rubber good.

Interior quite perfect. Carpeting too.

The engine compartment clean and everything appeared in order...to my eyes, at least. Radiator not dented or damaged or rusted. The engine was quite quiet and smooth.

The instrument panel, dash and all the interior surfaces were clean and undamaged. I knew from the video that the fuel gauge and clock did not work. The radio turned on but nothing. The temp gauge not connected but two replacements hung below the dash, coming from each head. Same with oil pressure after-market gauge hanging down.

Got down with my flashlight and looked at underside and found no rust issue. Minor rust spots. Really clean after 75 years....all of it.

So we took it out for a run. I was surprised by the engine noise coming through. Soooo....is their a sound-deadening mat available that could be inserted below the front edge of the carpet and up under the dash to block at least some of the engine noise?

Rode fine...except it has old-style tires! One of the first things I'll do is get the modern tires as I had on my two '47 Fords. The spare? Leave the old or replace it also? Shifts smoothly, as I remember it. Clutch seemed fine. He took it up to 65 mph. Then I drove it and seemed fine except for the difference radial tires would make.

Back to the business, talked about what needed to be done. And he offered to knock off \$1,000 for an as-is sale...no repairs by them! Called my financial manager and transfer of funds will be made.
